LIFTS AND SLOPES OPEN IN ALMOST ALL DOLOMITI SUPERSKI AREAS FROM DECEMBER 3RD – SELLARONDA INCLUDED

On Saturday, 3 December 2022, the official opening of lifts and slopes in most of the Dolomiti Superski ski resorts is scheduled. After Cortina (Col Gallina), Kronplatz, 3 Cime Dolomites (Passo Monte Croce), Val di Fiemme (Pampeago) and Obereggen last week, on December 3rd the ski resorts of Alta Badia, Val Gardena, Val di Fassa, Carezza, Arabba/Marmolada, Rio Pusteria-Bressanone, Alpe Lusia/San Pellegrino and Rolle Pass will also open. In total, there will be more than 200 open lifts and up to 400 km of slopes accessible in 13 out of 15 Dolomiti ski resorts. The Alpe di Siusi ski resorts will start his activity on 7 December, San Martino di Castrozza and Civetta will open on 8 December 2022. The Sellaronda will be open in both skiing directions from December 3rd onwards.

People love to ski

The prelude at Kronplatz, Cortina-Col Gallina, 3 Cime Dolomites-Passo Monte Croce, Val di Fiemme-Pampeago and Obereggen last weekend recorded a considerable number of local, domestic and international ski enthusiasts for the start of the 2022-23 winter season, the first "normal" one after the pandemic. In total, the first weekend recorded +32% of first entries compared with the first skiing weekend last year. "The offer of lifts and open slopes and the very favorable weather has encouraged many fans to start the ski season

in the Dolomites. We hope to be able to expand even more the number of slopes ready to be enjoyed by skiers by December 3 and then for the first December holidays" comments Andy Varallo, Chairman of Dolomiti Superski on the eve of the "official" start of the 22-23 ski season in the world's largest ski destination.

Online ski pass at -5%

Dolomiti Superski has significantly strengthened its **online shop**, where you can buy almost all types of ski passes, loading them directly on the rechargeable **My Dolomiti Card** ski pass support or collecting them with the digital voucher at the new **Tickets Self-Service** points located in the various locations. These are automated devices enabled to purchase ski passes via touch screen and to issue ski passes by scanning the digital voucher on paper or from smart phones. Daily and multi-day ski passes purchased online at least 2 days before the date of use, will be **discounted by 5%**.

Compulsory liability insurance and helmet for minors

We'd like to remind you, that since 1 January 2022 there is an obligation to insure liability against third parties for those who practice certain winter sports in Italy, including alpine skiing. The user must be able to prove liability insurance coverage for damages against third parties while skiing. The insurance can be purchased online through the internet site of the insurance company – at all Skipass points of sale in Dolomiti Superski, a QR-code redirecting to this site is available. Obviously, all insurance policies of this gender apply. Police forces are in charge of carrying out checks – it is advisable to bring a photocopy of the policy or a statement of coverage from your insurance company. The obligation to wear a helmet has been extended to all minors – it is also recommended for adults, for their own safety. It is furthermore prohibited to ski under the effects of alcohol.

Special offer before snow

Until December 24th, the "**Dolomiti Superpremière**" promotion is ongoing, which provides a day of free accommodation and ski pass, if you book at least 4 days of ski holiday, in the facilities participating in the initiative.
